

During the Covid lockdown the choir has continued to meet regularly through Zoom online video conferencing, both learning new material and re-visiting old repertoire.

However, the one thing we cannot do online, due to the limitations of the technology, is sing together in real time. Not to be deterred, our conductor Sìleas Sinclair directed us through a project in the autumn and winter to put together a performance and video

of a new song, learned entirely at our online meetings.

The song is 'Mhòrag a Mhòrag' and tells a story from the archives of the MacDougall clan of Dunollie, set to a melody by Rachel Walker & arranged in four-part harmony by Sìleas. Following detailed technical instructions provided by Sìleas, choir members individually recorded themselves singing their part in time to a provided backing track. Sileas then undertook the immense and timeconsuming task of layering these individual tracks into a single performance accompanied by a video which was launched on our Facebook page in late January.

The choir is delighted with the end result which has been viewed over 18,000 times and had a hugely positive response online.
